

The Galileo affair was a sequence of events, beginning around 1616, culminating with the trial and condemnation of Galileo Galilei, one of the founders of modern science, to recant his theory that the Earth moves around the Sun. At a ceremony in Rome, before the Pontifical Academy of Sciences, Pope John Paul II officially declared Galileo Galilei "sinned against light."
